



**Do This First:
Call for Backup**

Spring Closet Cleaning

De-cluttering tips even hoarders can adhere to



MASTER THIS:

What Stays, What Goes

There are pieces you'll hold on to forever, like a classic leather jacket or your prom dress (ah, memories). But for the rest, ask yourself tough questions, says Jamie Novak, author of *1,000 Best Quick and Easy Organizing Secrets*. Does it fit? Is it comfy? And here's a big one: **If you saw it in the store today, would you buy it again?** If the answer to any of these is no, out it goes.

HOOKUP CULTURE

"Hooks are everything in a closet," says *WH*'s fashion director, Jacqueline Azria, who recommends 3M Command adhesives rather than nails. "They keep hangables off the floor and help you see more of your accessories and bags." Use them solo or make them multipurpose with these tips.

HOOK + STURDY HANGER

Place a hanger on the hook, then drape scarves or belts side by side on it. They'll all be visible at once instead of hidden in a pile.

HOOK + PLASTIC RINGS

Link a set of shower-curtain rings, then hang the top one from a hook. Slide drapables (like tees) through each to maximize vertical space.

HOOK + MINI POUCH

Store shirt buttons, shoe inserts, or little extras in a small bag hung on a hook so you know where to find them immediately.



Pro Tip: Divide and Conquer

"Never pull everything out of your closet all at once," says Novak. You'll run out of time, motivation, or both. **Instead, set a timer for 15 to 20 minutes and try to get through just one section, like your jeans or your jewelry, in one sitting.**
